September 2014 – update

Artist in Residence – Jane Watt

- Jane has developed her temporary project, Cabinet of Curiosities, and identified a series of locations and events at which her refurbished Cabinet will tour from mid September 2014 to November 2014 and potentially on later dates, yet to be confirmed
- Leaflets are currently being printed for these events please find copy attached
- A website for Cabinet of Curiosities is nearing completion and a holding page detailing tour dates will be available by w/c 8.9.14. Draft versions attached
- A logo has been designed for the Cabinet of Curiosities and badges are also being printed to accompany the Cabinet
- Jane has been appointed to continue her Residency into a second year programme during which the idea is to continue building a legacy archive of Jane's research and the community engagement projects and to create and print a small publication

Local Centre/The Square

- Artist Patricia Mackinnon-Day has been appointed to this commission
- Patricia has been working closely with the Landscape Agency in building her research and concept ideas
- Research has been extensive, her currents concept ideas are building upon crop planting, seeds research, and developments, which are being formulated into designs for a permanent commission potentially using light and a temporary engagement, programme which local schools and youth workshops.
- The Local Centre commission is integrated within the development programme and Patricia is liaising closely with the team on design and delivery stages.
- It is intended that her concept ideas will be presented to the Public Art Steering Panel at the next meeting due late September 2014

Gateways and Mapping

- Artists Vong Phaophanit and Claire Oboussier have been appointed to this commission
- They have been carrying out extensive research and are starting studio work with their assistant who will produce sketchup models to present at the next Public Art Steering Group meeting
